URBAN BEEKEEPING 101

Enter the world of fly catchers, grosbeaks, swallows, warblers, and red-shouldered hawks on a Filoli bird walk. Hundreds of migrating birds visit Filoli each year on their way from Central and South America to their breeding grounds farther north. Many birds decide to stay in these woodlands and nest. Don't forget your binoculars and a bird field guide (if you have them).

EMBROIDERY CLASSES

Using beautiful kits designed by the instructor, a graduate of the Royal School of Needlework at Hampton Court, students create individual pieces using a different technique in each workshop. These classes require no experience but can also be good for an accomplished embroiderer to brush up on techniques.

DRAWNWORK EMBROIDERY

This two-day class covers drawn embroidery work, where the ground fabric is prepared by withdrawing threads to produce an area on which decorative stitches can be worked. Twisted, knotted, and needle woven stitches will be demonstrated and there will be a choice of different stitches to play with. In addition, ribbons can be added to create lots of fun.

CREWELWORK

INTRODUCTION TO EMBROIDERY

GOLD AND SILK EMBROIDERY

and detention over felt padding. The silk is also used for some of the couching to balance the color within the design. The basics of both gold and silk are covered in this class, and it is fun to combine the two.
