### ROSE CARE SERIES



### FRUIT TREE ESPALIER

Instructor: Kate Nowell

In this two-part class, techniques required to develop and maintain an espalier fruit tree throughout the growing season are discussed and demonstrated. Participants receive valuable information on building a support structure, selecting plants, training techniques and maintaining mature trees long term.

#### PART I: The Espalier in Winter

## BOTANICAL ART CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

Botanical art combines the observational skills of a scientist and the sensibility of an artist to create beautiful and accurate renderings of plants. The Filoli Botanical Art Certificate Program offers a unique in-depth study of botanical art through challenging, integrated, and comprehensive courses. The curriculum includes the systematic study of artistic skills and concepts, basic botany and botanical art history. **Enrollment in the certificate program is not necessary to participate in these classes, however, prerequisites must be completed.**

### DRAWING PLANTS IN PERSPECTIVE I

Dates and Times: Saturdays, February 20 and March 5, 9:30 am – 4:00 pm and Wednesday, March 16, 9:30 am – 12:30 pm

Instructor: Lee McCaffree

This foundational course teaches students to accurately draw plants by observing basic botanical shapes and structures, then illustrating them in great detail with botanical accuracy. Each of the sessions focuses on one shape to emphasize and develop observation and foreshortening skills. Students learn to interpret hidden edges to achieve a believable drawing, and work on shading skills through value contrast to create three-dimensional shapes.

### NEW! WASHES AND GLAZES

Most botanical works use washes as a base. Students will work to understand and implement the flat washes, graded washes, and color change washes as they apply to natural subjects. By practicing washes, the role of water in the brush, in the pigment and on the paper can determine the wanted results. Glazing in layers will give more color variation and depth to a painting. Good practice for novices.

### HISTORY OF BOTANICAL ART

This understanding will help students move to a much higher level of achievement.

Continue your studies on day two by drawing, creating, and modifying greens, using grisaille techniques for shading and forms. Complete your three-day study by adding a flower or seasonal fruit from the Filoli Garden and practice finishing techniques like burnishing and clean-up.

## EMBROIDERY CLASSES

Embroidery is the art of decorating fabric with a needle and thread or yarn. Its age of origin is unknown, but examples survive from Ancient Egypt, Iron Age Northern Europe and Zhou Dynasty China. Using kits designed by the instructor, a graduate of the Royal School of Needlework at Hampton Court, students create individual pieces using a different technique in each workshop. These classes require no experience but can also be good for an accomplished embroiderer to brush up on techniques.
