BLOOMING CALENDAR YEAR

The following reflect the typical bloom time for the bulbs, annuals, perennials, shrubs, vines and trees at Filoli. All of these times are weather dependent, and in a given month or year can fluctuate up to two weeks or more if temperatures are warmer or cooler than “normal.” Some of the plants listed, particularly the annuals, may not be represented in the garden in a given year. - JANUARY** Camellias, Flowering apricots, Cornelian cherry, Tazetta narcissus, Primula
- FEBRUARY** Camellias, Magnolias, Flowering plums, Daphne, Forsythia, Quince, VEC Rosemary ‘Mozart’, VEC daffodils, Primula, Hellebores, Omphalodes, Daffodil field, Forsythia, Dutch hyacinths, Cornelian cherry, early tulips, Primula, Daffodils in pots, Peach trees, Magnolia ‘Elizabeth’, Magnolias
- MARCH** Spring bulbs, Daffodils in pots, Tulips, Flowering cherries, Burkwood viburnum, Chinese wisteria, Tree peonies, Bleeding heart, Candytuft, Clematis armandii, Redbud, Hellebore, Violas, Forget-me-nots, Wallflowers, Magnolias, Historic iris border, Pears, Flowering plums, Peach trees, Bearded iris, Rhododendrons, Crabapples, Leptospermum, Forsythia, Old roses including Rosa ‘Gold of Ophir’ and Rosa ‘Lady Banks’
- APRIL** Tree Peony, Spring Bulbs, Tulips, Late daffodils, Apples, Scilla, Iris, Redbud, Violas, Columbine, Wallflowers, Forget-me-nots, Ceanothus, Alliums, Viburnum ‘Mariesii’ and ‘Snowflake’, Dogwoods, Choisya, Friends’ Native garden, Wisteria, Loropetalum, Clematis montana, Azaleas, Rhododendrons, Lilacs, Weigela, Cherries, Camperdown elm, Foxgloves, Dianthus, Ornamental vegetables in the kitchen garden, Chinese fringe tree
- MAY** Roses, Hawthorns, Lavender, Knot gardens, Columbine, Sweet peas, Copper beech hedge, Delphiniums, Foxglove, Herbaceous peonies, Queen Anne’s Lace, Cutting garden, Clematis ‘Jackmanii’, Perennial border, Catmint, Campanula, Acanthus, Violas, Chinese Forget-Me-Not, Larkspur
- JUNE** Roses, Delphiniums, Knot gardens, Perennial border, Sweet peas, Lavender hedges, Campanula, Clematis hybrids, Leptospermum, Annual beds of begonias, Phlox, Petunias, Geraniums, Flowering tobacco, Zinnias, Sunflowers, Coreopsis, Salvias, Acanthus, Cotoneaster border
- JULY** Roses, Delphiniums, Hydrangeas, Pears in fruit, Salvia, Agapanthus, Clerodendrum, Annual beds, Eucryphia, Acanthus, Freesia laxa, Francoa, Pomegranates
- AUGUST** Roses, Delphiniums, Dahlias, Hibiscus hedge, Pears and apples in fruit, Summer annuals, Salvias, Summer Perennials, Hydrangea
- SEPTEMBER** Roses, Delphiniums, Hydrangea, Hibiscus hedge, Japanese anemone, Cyclamen hederifolium, Morning glory vines, Cutting gardens, Pomegranates, Clerodendrum, Francoa, Amaryllis belladonna, Silver lace vine, Perennial border, Sunflowers, Cosmos, Coreopsis, Ornamental vegetables in kitchen garden, Basils, Chili peppers
- OCTOBER** Fragrant osmanthus, Hydrangea, Sasanqua camellias, Morning glory vines, Tree dahlia, Salvias, Persimmon fruit, Ceratostigma, Ornamental vegetables in kitchen garden, Basils, Chili peppers, pomegranates
- NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER** Late apples, Pomegranates, Winter blooming Camellias, Fall colors from: Camperdown Elm, Copper beech hedge, Apples and pears, Cotinus, Japanese maples, Red Oak, Viburnums, Ginkgo, Hawthorns, Cherries, Parrotia
