Blue Gold

THE POWER
AND PRIVILEGE
OF WATER

Water systems shaped the Bay Area's geographic and population evolution – and controlling water was a path to power and wealth for Filoli's families. Today, water is more precious than ever in our drought-stricken state, and clean water is a privilege some are still denied.

The Blue Gold exhibit, opening June 2, traces Filoli's water story through time.

1000 Ramaytush Ohlone people from the Lamchin tribe live in a creekside village called Supichom on the land that's now Filoli.



1920s The Bourns have trouble digging wells at Filoli to water their new garden. A 1924 drought forces them to let the lawns go brown.



1934 The first water from the Hetch Hetchy Valley reservoir flows to the Bay Area through the Pulgas Water Temple next door to Filoli.



1850s San Francisco's Gold Rush boom causes a water shortage. In dry times, water ferried from Sausalito is sold from mule-drawn carts for a gold dollar per bucket.



Heaviest Stock Holder Succeeds Captain A. H. Payson as President

1908 William Bourn becomes president of the Spring Valley Water Company, which has a monopoly on San Francisco's water supply.



1950s The Matson Navigation Company, founded by Lurline Roth's father, pioneers the use of shipping containers to transport goods across the Pacific.



Today Filoli works to conserve water amid drought conditions and annual wildfires. This summer, we're experimenting with succulents and low-water plants in the Garden.


